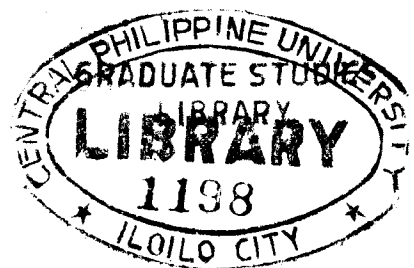

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ABSTRACT

This study was conducted in order to assess the corporate social responsibility (CSR) programs of Dingle Government Workers Development Cooperative (DGWDC), and to know if indeed DGWDC's social services has rendered satisfaction to its stakeholders. The study focused on the social services rendered by DGWDC to the stakeholders. After assessing DGWDC's CSR programs, a social development plan was made.

The respondents of this study were members of the DGWDC who resides in Dingle. The members are classified as the employees, officers of DGWDC, DepEd, and other government agencies where they were currently employed. This is a descriptive research which utilized interview and questionnaires in gathering data.
